He told a crowd of 6,000 people that he felt compelled to come out of retirement having met "two Armenian gentlemen" who had described atrocities "horribly accumulated outrages" which he said, "the powers of language hardly suffice to adequately describe".



What Does The Convention Require?

Genocide means any of the following acts committed with the intent to destroy, in whole or in part, a national, ethnic, racial, or religious group, as such:

- (a) Killing members of the group;
- (b) Causing serious bodily or mental harm to members of the group;
- (c) Deliberately inflicting on the group conditions of life calculated to bring about its physical destruction in whole or in part;
- (d) Imposing measures intended to prevent births within the group;
- (e) Forcibly transferring children of the group to another group.

Duty to prevent

- ▶ Although the 1948 Genocide Convention imposed a duty to prevent, it said no more than that, and it would take the barbaric massacre at Srebrenica in 1995 and the Bosnian genocide for the International Court of Justice to provide such clarification in its judgment of Bosnia and Herzegovina v. Serbia and Montenegro.
- It says the duty to prevent arises "At the instant that the State learns of, or should normally have learned of, the existence of a serious risk that genocide will be committed."


